

Phoenix Christian High School ART0730 Advanced Art Course Scope & Sequence (2010)

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Advanced Art provides a continued development of the skills and techniques learned in Art 2. Project difficulty increases and a higher level of skills are expected.

REQUIRED TEXTS AND *KEY SUPPLEMENTAL MATERIALS

Instructional materials will be provided as needed.

COURSE SCOPE AND SEQUENCE

First Semester

Students will begin by doing a series of 4 drawings. One using color pencils from a photo reference, 1 using color pencils and a colorless blender, 1 relief where the drawing is cut out of layers of cardboard and built up and colored, and 1 carved out of wall board. Students will then begin to focus and explore media that they feel is their chosen gift. Students may choose to work with colored pencils, pastels, charcoal, graphite, oils, tempera, watercolors, or any other approved media.

Assessments: For students who select this option of the class, projects will be graded on completion, neatness and creativity. All projects must be original works.

Biblical Integration: Students are accepted at this level because God has given them a gift, or an ability to create and work with different media competently. They are encouraged to use those God given gifts, not only to do work that glorifies Him, but to do work that is pleasing to them, and to push their talents to the max.*

(All Biblical Integrations are the same for the class, regardless of the medium or assignments they choose.)

Second Semester

Individual Projects—Clay and Crafts

Key Concepts: Students will explore media that they feel is the area they want to concentrate on. They may choose from clay, or an enormous assortment of craft projects

Assessments: Individual Projects, completion, how class time and resources are used and neatness as well as creativity and originality of the project.
